**Selection will be based on the completed application and will be at the discretion of the Scholarship Selection Committee.**

All applicants must include the following:

\*Two letters of recommendation

\*Personal resume of not more than 300 words, prepared by the applicant-including:

\*High School or College GPA, SAT scores or other similar information

\*Voluntary community activities, leadership activities, etc.

\*Employment history

\*Education opportunities beyond High School

\*Transcript of all academic work in high school or post high school

\*Typewritten answers to the following questions (answers should be no more than 50 words each)

Questions for Native American candidates:

1. As a Native American, in what ways do you benefit from participation in Native American cultural events?

2. What are the strengths and weaknesses of the educational program for Native Americans in your area?

3. If you are selected for the scholarship, how will it benefit your community?

Questions for the local candidates:

1. What does it mean to you to be living in the traditional homeland of Chief Joseph?

2. What benefits do you see in preserving the cultures of the various ethnic groups that make up America?

3. If you are selected for this scholarship, how will it benefit your community?
